The owner of Newsome Mill has made an application for Listed Building Consent to demolish the entire ground floor of the mill and the weaving sheds at the corner of Hart Street. This is a really important decision for Newsome and we want to make sure that the people who live and work here, and the people who grew up here, have a voice in what happens next.

What Historic England say about the proposed demolition

“The total loss of these buildings will considerably impact on the significance of the Grade II listed building and we consider this harm is unjustified.”

“Together the buildings continue to contribute to the streetscape and there is an important relationship with the stable block on the south side of Ruth Street. Furthermore they provide an important context to the clock tower and archway which remain central to the mill complex.”

“The application does not demonstrate that all options have been explored in order to retain the remaining walls... Historic England objects to the application on heritage grounds.”
